**ICAO COURSE DEVELOPERS AND INSTRUCTORS  
STANDARDIZATION (CDI/STD) MEETING  
New Delhi, India, 24 to 26 October 2018**

1. The International Civil Aviation Organization's (ICAO) Global Aviation Training (GAT) Office will convene a Course Developers and Instructors Standardization (CDI/STD) Meeting in New Delhi, India, from 24 to 26 October 2018. The meeting will be hosted by the Indian Aviation Academy (IAA), an ICAO TRAINAIR PLUS Member.
2. The objective of this meeting is to provide training professionals with a unique opportunity to address challenges, identify solutions and exchange best practices for the improvement of training deliverables. It will enable training professionals from diverse organizations to engage with each other to determine the best way forward in their training capacity-building endeavours. Networking opportunities during the event will also encourage greater collaboration in training and the formation of new training partnerships.

The meeting consists of a series of dynamic sessions where participants will focus on implementing the 8 essential components of Aviation Training Intelligence available to them for planning, developing and delivering the optimal training solutions to meet the needs of the growing air transport system, locally and globally. Experts will offer their solutions to training challenges. The meetings will close with recommended best practices.
